- (2) Friedman also accepts a certain kind of tax-funded poverty relief program. What is the program, and why does Friedman think that imposing taxes to pay for it would promote everyone's welfare? (How does poverty relief promote the welfare of people who are not poor?)
- (3) What does Friedman mean by the principle of "equality of treatment"? What is Friedman's objection to government attempting to promote "equality of treatment"?
